VANDALISM AT CHEDDINGTON RECREATION GROUND. The Parish Council is glad to report that since the last Newsletter in December no more incidents of vandalism have been reported at the Recreation Ground. Fingers crossed it remains this way!

USE OF DOG WASTE AND LITTER BINS.

Just a reminder that there are currently 13 dog waste bins dotted around the village that Bucks Council empty weekly. The dog bins in Orchard Manor are emptied by the managing agent for the development. There seems to be a misunderstanding by residents about where they can dispose of dog waste. Many believe they must use the designated village bins and that they should not put bags in their own household general waste bin. So just to clarify you put dog waste bags in your household green general waste bin. It is obviously important that the bags are securely tied to prevent any leaks or odours!

The Parish Council also asks that out of courtesy for others, please do not use the village litter bins for dog waste bags and definitely do not leave dog bags on the ground beside the dog and litter bins, especially if they are near a residential property. Take it home! It also seems that some residents are 'stocking up' the bags and then depositing them in both the dog and litter bins, which is clearly not very pleasant for our handyfolk who empty the litter bins!

The Parish Council appreciates your co-operation with this.

BUCKS COUNCILLORS NEWS.

No ifs, no butts – Council demonstrates its zero-tolerance on sales of illegal tobacco, cigarettes and vapes. Buckinghamshire Council has once again demonstrated its zero-tolerance to those attempting to sell counterfeit and illegal vapes and cigarette and tobacco products in the county, following recent successful court action against three local businesses.

In November, Smokey World, in Castle Street, High Wycombe, was issued with a closure order by Wycombe Magistrates to run for three months and later the same month Red Power in Aylesbury was also served with a closure order for a period of three months. Most recently, Stoke Convenience Store in Stoke Road, Aylesbury, was served with a one-month closure order at a hearing at Milton Keynes Magistrates' Court on Tuesday 3 December.

All three premises had been subject to investigations by officers from Buckinghamshire and Surrey Trading Standards, having been caught selling a variety of illicit products including illegal vapes, counterfeit cigarettes and hand rolling tobacco in test purchasing exercises carried out by undercover officers. A number of operations involving tobacco detection dogs were also carried out at the locations. These specialist canines are trained to sniff out cigarettes and tobacco that is hidden from sight. At Smokey World the dogs were able to locate counterfeit good concealed behind sophisticated false wall panels. Stoke Convenience Store was also caught selling both regular vapes and alcohol to underage shoppers.

The closure orders were sought under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, and mean neither of the premises is allowed to open for trade during the three month/one month period respectively. If the orders are breached, those involved are liable for arrest and could receive up to 51 weeks in prison, or a fine, or both.

Man caught littering sees penalty soar to more than £1,100 after failing to pay Fixed Penalty. A man who failed to pay a simple £150 Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) for littering in March 2024 has paid a hefty price for his crime, as the costs rise to more than £1,100 in court.

Ricardo Allen of Hawkins Road, London, was convicted of an offence of littering in his absence, at Wycombe Magistrates Court on 16 October 2024.

The court heard that on Wednesday 6 March 2024, a vehicle was recorded littering on Broughton Lane, Aylesbury. The offence was recorded by a dashcam provided by another driver. The footage played a key role in the investigation, capturing the offence and an image of the litter being discarded from the window.

The vehicle was traced to Allen who attended an interview in Aylesbury, where he was shown the dashcam footage. The litter consisted of food waste, specifically takeaway packaging containing chicken bones. The driver received a £150 Fixed Penalty Notice for the littering offence, however, he refused to pay. In cases like this, Buckinghamshire Council gathers sufficient evidence to prosecute in the event of non-payment and as this happened in this instance, there was no choice but to initiate court action.

On Wednesday 16 October 2024, the evidence was presented at a hearing held in the defendant's absence, as he chose not to attend the court.



The court found Mr Allen guilty. Legal costs were imposed, totalling £798.96, which additionally included a fine of £220 and a victim surcharge of £88.00. Allen was ordered to pay the total amount of £1,106.94 within 28 days.

Company learns the hard way – NEVER pay cash to have your waste removed.

A waste company which paid another company to take away waste from their own vehicle when it broke down has been prosecuted in court after the waste was found dumped by the roadside in Buckinghamshire.

Complete Waste Management Ltd, based in Essex, pleaded guilty to the offence of failing in their duty of care when transferring waste to a waste remover, when the case was heard at High Wycombe Magistrates' Court on 27 November 2024.

The court heard that on 14 September 2023, a mixture of household and building waste was found dumped at Ibstone Road in Stokenchurch. Buckinghamshire Council's waste enforcement team carries out regular searches of the area, due to it being heavily blighted with fly-tipping. On this occasion, an enforcement officer found details amongst the waste belonging to an address in Fairlight Road, London.

Enquiries identified a company called Complete Waste Management Ltd who explained that they recognised the waste, and they had removed the waste from the property in London. Complete Waste Management Ltd explained that when they removed the waste initially, their vehicle broke down and was unable to move. In order for the recovery vehicle to take their van away, the waste on the back needed to be removed.

Complete Waste Management Ltd found a company to remove the waste from their van and arranged for its removal, explaining that this was the last they heard of it. Complete Waste Management Ltd said they paid £150 cash but did not do the appropriate checks and so when the waste was later found dumped illegally, they admitted liability.

Magistrates at High Wycombe Magistrates' Court fined Complete Waste Management Ltd £600 and ordered them to pay a contribution of £1546.71 towards the council's clean up and investigation costs. A victim surcharge was also added of £240 – making a total to pay of £2,386.71.

Council produces balanced budget amidst financial challenges. Buckinghamshire Council has published its updated medium-term financial plan which details how it will balance its budget for the next three years.

In a continuing acutely challenging financial context for local government, the council has worked hard to identify the further savings needed during the next financial year to balance the books until 2028. It's also produced a detailed budget proposal for 2025/26 including how much it's planning to spend on major projects and services, following consultation with residents.

The current financial year has seen demand rise further still particularly in four key services, namely adult social care, children's social care, transporting higher needs children to and from school and providing temporary accommodation for homeless people and families. Cost and demand for these services mean they're considerably overspent, particularly where 'high needs' children's services are concerned as the cost to the council is higher than the grant provided by government for these services. Given that nearly 80% of the council's budget is funded through council tax, the budget proposals recommend raising the base rate of coun-

cil tax by 2.99%, alongside a 2% rise in the Adult Social Care precept, meaning a total 4.99% rise in bills next year, which represents an extra £1.77 per week for the average Band D home in 2025/26.

The council has worked extremely hard to find further savings, efficiencies and other mitigations to allow it to produce a balanced budget and is offsetting the rising costs by identifying £115.6 million in further savings and income. Alongside the savings made through becoming a unitary council, overall Buckinghamshire Council will have made savings of more than £230 million from the time it came into being in 2020 through to the end of this budget period in 2028.

The updated budget proposals for 2025/26 include a commitment to dedicate significant funding to key projects and priorities for residents. These include:

- Extra funding for our roads, taking the total investment to £120 million
- £24.8 million to support regeneration
- £10.7 million on climate change and flood management
- £24.8 million to support housing and homelessness
- £188.8 million on schools and school improvement projects
- £30.4 million on our Household Recycling Centres, Waste vehicles and other waste projects

Have your say on making local places safe to live, visit and work. Buckinghamshire Council is set to review its active Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs), originally introduced to combat anti-social behaviour in public spaces under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, and is now seeking views from those who live, work in or visit Buckinghamshire.

Many of these PSPOs, now over a decade old, remain under the names of former Buckinghamshire councils and vary significantly in their prohibitions.

The council's review aims to:

- Unify all orders under Buckinghamshire Council's juris diction
- Ensure consistent prohibitions across the county
- · Review and amend existing prohibitions as necessary
- Evaluate PSPO locations for relevance, extension, or removal

The council has already consulted with external partners on the review, and they are now inviting people to participate in a public consultation, which is available on the council's Your Voice Bucks webpage.

The consultation will run until 16 February 2025.

This is an opportunity for the community to share their views on the relevance and necessity of the current PSPOs and suggest new prohibitions. The consultation responses, along with supporting crime and anti-social behaviour data, will be analysed to determine which areas in Buckinghamshire will be subject to a PSPO.

FARMING AND FOOD

It has been a joy to walk in the frosty weather over the last few days. The hoar frost is particularly beautiful. Seeing the avenue between the two villages frosted and with a deep blue sky as background has been very special and reminded me of our early days here at Mentmore Park Farm when this was not an unusual sight. I deliberately left my mobile behind to see and listen to the nature around us.

We lost our dear old black labrador Oscar aged 14.5 just before Christmas. He was a lovely character, kind and loving. Welcoming to everyone and always pleased to come running over with a gift. Probably an old dog toy but no matter! Now we have Maisie who is ten months and quite a handful. However, she is gentle and loving too.

Christmas and New Year are a time to relax and take stock for arable farmers. The winter crops are established and we hope full of promise. Weather permitting. We hope for gentle rains and warm sunshine as Spring approaches. Ideally some good weather in March to enable the drilling of the spring crops. Of course, the big news in farming is the imposition of inheritance tax on business assets over a million. Irrespective of trade many mutigenerational businesses will be affected.

Farmers enjoy growing food and rising to the challenges of nature especially weather! The farm shops and local butchers which have popped up in recent years prove this and we hope you will continue to support these places. There is nothing more important than eating locally grown vegetables and meat.

We recently watched the documentary on Warburtons and wondered if some of our wheat ends up in their loaves. The same applies to Shredded Wheat and Weetabix manufactured not far from here. Our wheat goes to a grain merchant and they sell it on to these manufacturers.

Farmers consider themselves to be custodians of the countryside. We've always tried to keep our farms well maintained. Hedges, ditches, woodland and field margins. Its also great to share these areas and so we keep the footpaths clear and well maintained. We don't see as many walkers since the Covid epidemic but we hope the regulars enjoy their walks and appreciate the nature and farming.

Most of us have diversified into other businesses on our farms to make a better living for ourselves. For instance, business units and offices in redundant farm buildings.

A new year brings a fresh start and new perspective. So, we will look on the bright side and hope for good health and good weather for ourselves and everyone.

Cheddington has changed enormously when you think of the days with the railway line to Aylesbury, the orchards all around and all the shops in the village. Many people were employed on the farms and I can remember the mothers and children picking the fruit at the Cheddington orchard in their summer holidays. I can also remember the sheep being driven through the village to new pastures in Mentmore.

A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Kairos or Coincidence? Is there such a thing as coincidence in the Christian vocabulary? Within a short period of time, I've had three incredible experiences which I rule out as coincidence, but I term 'Kairos moments' – the right or critical moment for a crucial action. I was in my office and the Holy Spirit prompted me to call two members who acknowledged the timeliness of my call as one of them was about to have a hip operation.

On the second occasion, the Holy Spirit prompted me to call another member who unbeknown to me was celebrating his birthday.

The third experience occurred while I was leading service at Swanbourne Methodist Church. For the very first time, I asked the congregation if they had any prayer requests. Surprisingly, one of the members shared that her daughter had a blood clot in her lung. I prayed for her. This young lady returned to church and shared, "I believe that when you prayed for me, my pain eased, and I am going to make it a commitment to come to church once each month."

I know within myself that these experiences were not coincidence or random action but Kairos moments where the living breath of God through the Holy Spirit moved me to get in touch at poignant moments in the lives of His children.

My desire is for 2025 to be a year where at the heart of ministry I do my best to be led by the Spirit so that I could discern those Kairos moments. We have been journeying with a close family friend from the very beginning of her terminal pancreatic cancer diagnosis. During the Christmas I was moved to visit her in the hospital because I felt that I needed to see her. I anointed her with oil with faith that she will rise in glory.

Deep within, I want to be able to recognize even more the Kairos moments – those God moments when I am certain that I am led and guided by the Holy Spirit. As we open our hearts to God and allow His Holy Spirit to work within us, we can experience those Kairos moments – the God

moments where we are confident it is not coincidence.


Scripture is filled with Kairos moments that rule out coincidence. Jesus is presented as one who knows the Kairos moments. Think of that story when he decided to visit Samaria. He knew that the Samaritan woman was visiting the well in the noon day heat after being estranged from her community.

That Kairos moment transformed the life of this woman and broadened the ministry of Christ, "Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?" They left the city and were on their way to him.' (John 4:29-30)'

What we term as coincidences are Kairos moments.


