BUCKS COUNCILLORS NEWS.

The new photo ID requirements for the General Election. Buckinghamshire Council is reminding residents that to vote in the General Election on 4 July they will need to have registered to vote and to show a valid photo ID at polling stations.

This now applies to:

- Local elections
- UK General elections
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections
- · UK parliamentary by-elections
- Recall petitions

You can apply for a free voter ID certificate, known as a Voter Authority Certificate, if:

- · You don't have an accepted form of photo ID
- You're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you
- You're worried about using an existing form of ID for any other reasons, such as the use of a gender marker

To find out more about what ID is accepted and to apply for free voter ID, if you need it, look here: https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/i-am-a/voter/voter-id

The deadline to apply for free voter ID in time for the 4 July General Election is 5pm on 26 June.

For people registered to vote by post, no photo ID will be required. This is because postal voting requires other identification checks, such as signature and date of birth verification.

Sarah Ashmead, Buckinghamshire Council's Deputy Chief Executive and Returning Officer, said:

"You will need to show an accepted form of photo ID for the General Election on 4 July 2024.

Find out more about what to expect on polling day by visiting Buckinghamshire Council's website.

The council is urging residents to share this information with friends and relatives who may be unaware of these voter ID changes or need assistance with applying for the necessary documents. Booklets containing relevant information are also available at Buckinghamshire libraries; you can also use the computers in our libraries to register to vote and find out more about voter ID.

FARMING AND FOOD

Farmers always talk about the weather because timing of our work is reliant on the weather and the condition of the soil in which we plant our food. Cheddington is surrounded by agriculture. Within a couple of miles of our village we have sheep farming, dairy and beef herds, egg producers and cereal and legumes grown. In addition, the pick your own fruit and vegetable farm at lvinghoe. We are able to source everything locally in season.

All of us are watching our very late drilled crops to see if we are going to get a reasonable harvest. This year the answer is that we will not do so. So, we just look forward and hope that the weather will become kinder to us and new ideas about weed control and what to grow in our fields will be successful.

Nationally the weather has an impact on animal feed to the stock farmers as well as food for ourselves. The prices of bread, breakfast cereals, meat, vegetables and beer are increasing. To name just a few.

Around Cheddington we have excellent farm shops, Grooms in Ivinghoe and Meads in Wilstone, where we can buy all these locally grown products. However, cereals from our farm may be found in Weetabix, Muesli and our beer...so go to, what we call, The Top Shop! Cheddington Stores!

It's really important to realise that all our British food is produced to a very high standard. Standards which can be traced back to source. Cheap food from an unknown producer may be grown overseas where the workers are not rewarded properly for their work or the animals may be kept in poor conditions or chemicals used freely without careful consideration.

By the time this Newsletter is distributed we will have harvest workers arriving on our farm. We will also be anticipating a new government in Westminster. I think I can speak for us all when I say I'm very anxious about that!

Heavy and wide, slow-moving machinery will be on our roads carrying loads of corn and heavy bales. All the corn is transported back to our grain dryer, cleaning and storage facilities at Mentmore Park Farm. What we ask for is that drivers give us time and space! Make sure you are visible to the tractor driver and be patient. Please. Our drivers have been trained to look out for you... please look out for them too.

FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE HOS-PICE NEWS. New Electric Van Shows Charity's Commitment to Going Green.

Florence Nightingale Hospice Charity has invested in a new electric van for its retail operation. The Charity's 13 shops provide much-needed income for the Hospice in Stoke Mandeville and the electric van will move donations from the public around their shops in Buckinghamshire. The van demonstrates the Charity's commitment to operating responsibly, supporting sustainable shopping though zero emissions. Funding for the van was provided by Angels Den, Fairhive, Perrys, Travis Perkins and West Herts Charity Trust.

Head of Retail, Lily Caswell explains "One of the ways we plan to meet the growing need for hospice care is to keep increasing the income we raise in our shops. We are growing our shop numbers – we now have 13 shops from Buckingham to Beaconsfield, and plans to open more.

"We rely on our retail van to transfer stock between our shops and make the best use of the donations we are given. Our van covers an amazing 16,000 miles a year and moves tonnes of clothing, accessories, books and toys to keep our shops full of amazing product for our customers to buy."

Charity shopping is becoming more popular and it's also a more sustainable way for to live, with its emphasis on recycling. Donors donate goods that they no longer need to charity shops, and shoppers buy them, in increasing numbers as income from retail is at a record high for the Charity. Donating unwanted clothes, books, toys, household goods is an invaluable way to support the Charity. All proceeds are invested into hospice care, providing end of life support to people in their homes and at the Hospice in Stoke Mandeville.

Lily continued "We are absolutely delighted that we now have a fabulous new electric van to help us, and are immensely grateful to all of the generous donors who made buying the van possible. Our big blue electric van will support sustainable shopping in Buckinghamshire, with zero emissions, to ultimately raise as much money as possible for hospice care. Helping local people, while helping the planet at the same time – what could be better than that?"







The other is longer-term and connected with bigger life goals that might well depend on pending exam results. Both of these journeys involve some form of planning and anticipation, and perhaps also some precautions should things not work out as hoped, but otherwise

they are clearly very different. Longer-term journeying requires a deeper sense of orientation and also a heftier degree of stamina to continue to focus on a goal. For many people it stimulates a discipline of enduring prayerfulness. Moreover, it requires discernment as to whether the goal is really the best or most appropriate one for us, and may need nuancing, or in some cases changing more sharply. Some points along the way may well involve crossroads with conflicting signs, or even an apparent choice of slightly different routes to the same overall destination. These require an engaging, prayerful discernment on our part.

As most people reading this will know, the benefice too stands at a key point on its journey forward. The advert for the vacant post of Team Rector following Revd Howard's departure to Derbyshire is, at the time of writing, just about to go live. By the time this article will be read the application deadline will be upon us and shortlisting be due to follow very soon. We pray that we do get a decent number of applicants and that those responsible for shortlisting and interviewing may be discerning in their task.

I am also aware that this will be my last newsletter contribution before my wife and I move out of the benefice. We have enjoyed our time here and wish you all the very best for the vacancy period and what lies beyond. We hope very much that a new Team Rector will be with you before Christmas and a new Team Vicar very soon after that. Thank you to all those who are working on the required process for these appointments, and our prayers and thanks to all who will be covering during the vacancy. May it prove a positive opportunity for the churches in the benefice to discern the next stage together.

This is a polite reminder that the compost bin is only for organic waste and unsuitable for plastics and wreaths which contain metal. These should be disposed of at home. All non-organic waste has to be taken home by our volunteer so your ongoing co-operation would be very much appreciated.

From the Minister:

God's Calling!

The call of God comes in different seasons of our lives that compels us to change course. Your trajectory might be a medical doctor, accountant, scientist, businessman/woman, musician, teacher, nurse or electrician – the truth is you can be an electric presbyter – all skills are needed on deck. Why not give God a chance?

To each of us the call comes in a particular form but always in an irresistible constraint. The experience is real, as real as the bread we eat or the water we drink. Mine was a silent hush of God's presence, as I sat on the couch – light as a feather his finger touched me. I was assured that it was no longer I in that space, but a phenomenon beyond self and outside self. I was persuaded beyond any doubt that God's call was for me, undeniably unlettered as those who responded to the call 'follow me and I will make you fish for people'.

To each of us the call has its origins in the eternal counsels of God: before Jeremiah was born, he was a thought in the mind of God — "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born, I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations." (Jeremiah 1:4). The word consecrated here bears its original meaning, 'set apart.' Jeremiah is a predestined man. God also knew you before the foundations of the earth and has set you a part for a purpose. At the tender age of twelve, as I was walking down the aisle of the Bethel Centenary Methodist Church, Montserrat, my uncle-in-law said to me, "Rose you have a voice to be a minister." I was therefore obliged to visit him before I started theological seminary. "Rose", he said, "do you remember what I told you."

To each of us the call might be scary. Jeremiah was called to the prophetic ministry which is included in the ministry of the presbyter or deacon where we are called to be God's messenger – God's mouthpiece. You may think that it is out of your league, unsuitable, or unimaginable but God calls. The prophet trembles before such a lofty call: unlike Isaiah but like Moses he shrinks from this awful responsibility. The Greek renders better: 'I am too young'. The prophet is probably about 20 years of age: he is God's chosen vessel and God uses him for His purpose.

To each of us grace specialises. With Isaiah grace is cleansing, with Jeremiah it is empowering. I still recall that

Sunday morning in 1998, as I was preaching about the prodigal son, I was endowed with the anointing of the Holy Spirit. Throughout biblical history those who responded to God's call initially felt a great sense of inadequacy, but as Paul says, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

To each of us God's calling is about God with us - "Do not say, 'I am only a boy'; for you shall go to all to whom I send you, and you shall speak whatever I command you, do not be afraid of them for I am with you to deliver you, says, the LORD." God is projected as bossy here, but God is saying to Jeremiah, 'I am going to be with you, so you don't have to worry or be afraid'. Part of the protocol at the United Theological College of the West Indies (UTC), involved leading devotions on a team of four students and a lecturer in the chapel during the week. I was a member of the first team to begin the new academic year alongside the late Reverend Dr Llewellyn Williams, President of the UTC. "Sir, I am unqualified to be part of this team," I said cowardly to Dr Williams. "I don't know who you are or where you are from, but one thing I do know, is that you are a seasoned prophetess," he responded. Reverend Dr Williams was reassuring me that God is with me. One of the most beautiful aspects of ministry is the assurance that Yahweh is with us. You may be feeling unqualified, inadequate and afraid, but God is with you. John Wesley said, "Best of all, God is with us."

To each of us the task to which we are called might seem insurmountable, but God is with us. The work the prophet is called to do was bigger than himself, is of both destructive and constructive nature. Perhaps we should omit, 'to destroy and to overthrow'. For this reason, our calling is a vocation – it is not a job. If it was a job many would have already quit. One does not retire but superannuate instead. Yet it is one of the most fulfilling journeys you can embark on.

To each of us, the call of God is progressive. Some of us are satisfied by just being a member but, God might be calling you to be a steward, treasurer, youth leader, children's worker or making teas and coffees. It all begins somewhere. The prophet Jerimiah is satisfied where he is. He thought he is only a boy and didn't have the necessary credentials for the progressive activity as a prophet. He thought he is too inexperienced. But the call is marked by provisions: "Then the LORD put out his hand and touched my mouth; and the LORD said to me, "Now I have put my words in your mouth." God equips those who respond to his call.

I cannot accentuate this enough; the Church needs you more than ever. History teaches us that the church is not sustained by the empty pews but people. There is a seat at the chapel for you. Church is not as scary as you may think. We are ordinary folks who go to the supermarket and pull weeds from our garden. Yet, we are called to join in this extraordinary tradition, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." (Noreen)
